



Winding Back the Clock—ACCAW Style No 10 — David & Nerida Cornell

Another look into the past—David & Nerida Cornell joined the ACCAW in July 1982, after moving to Albury from Sydney, in order to take up the roll of a Manager & Engineer position of a local company. David, when residing in Sydney completed an apprenticeship as a motor mechanic, specialising in Diesel Engineering. At this time, David became involved in 'Timed Lap Dash Racing' and 'Hill Climbing' at Oran Park and Amaroo Race Tracks, hence his interest in cars, bikes and motors. David and Nerida had previously visited Albury on numerous occasions to visit friend Colin Rawlings, who was a member of the ACCAW. David and Nerida moved to Albury in 1978 when David took up a position as Sales Manager & Engineer for Marine Industrial Transmission, then later ran his own business specialising in industrial and marine transmissions. It was at this point, Colin Rawlings invited David and Nerida to join our club, which then leads us into David's 44 year association with the ACCAW.

For the records, David has served as President of the ACCAW on 3 separate occasions—1988-89, 2012 & again in 2017–18. As Secretary in 1985 and again in 1997-98. David has served as a Committee Member for countless years and was appointed as a ACCAW Inspection & Compliance Officer, a position which he has held for in excess of 40 years. David and Nerida were also responsible for organising and planning numerous Club Rallies and Events, including the infamous ACCAW 'Booligal Rallies' & a 'Bay to Birdwood' trip. This continuous involvement and commitment culminated in David being awarded Life Membership of the ACCAW in 2000.



Above: 1953—An image of David's first road vehicle, a 1952 Lambretta LD, which he purchased against his father's wishes after receiving his NSW Licence at the age of 16yrs and 10 months. David used this vehicle to ride to work each day during his apprenticeship. This Lambretta was highly modified to racing standards, running on ethanol fuel and was capable of travelling at speeds in excess of 100 mph. After falling of the scooter on numerous occasions and even being knocked off by a caravan, David eventually deregistered the scooter and placed it in storage whilst he completed his National Service Training in 1957.



Above: 1958—After completing National Service Training David proceeded to acquire several vehicles. A 1937 Hillman Minx (left) and a 1953 FX Holden (centre), pictured here in the back yard of David's mother's house in Angus Avenue West Epping, a suburb of Sydney. The FX was David's daily driver and upon marrying Nerida in 1962 was driven on their honeymoon to Kingaroy Qld. David later sold the Hillman to Nerida's cousin in 1961. The Hillman on the right belonged to one of David's close friends at the time.



Right: 1959—Nerida relaxing on the bonnet of David's 1937 Hillman Minx whilst courting on a weekend drive in the Sydney area.





Above left: 1965—No 58 Formula 'R' Racing Renault, which was totally build by David and used in Hill Climb events and Timed Lap Dash trails at Oran Park and Amaroo Park in Sydney. At the time, this was the fastest car in its' category in Australia. Unfortunately David managed to prang the Renault—after repairs, David sold the vehicle so as to build a Brabham BT 23 replica (No 85), which he built from scratch and raced for 11 years before selling the vehicle to his brother in 1978 when David and Nerida moved to Albury. 
