However, to ensure that all processes are operating properly, the Committee will review how the inspection sessions operate to ensure a robust process, including a review of the club's relevant insurance.

Members were advised that Karl Richardson (ACCAW vehicle inspector) has offered his car hoist for use by members if their vehicle registration does not fall due around the time when the ACCAW vehicle inspection day occurs, ie November each year.



## Down at the Volksy Shed.

## 'Down at the Volksy Shed'

#### A short article presented by ACCAW Member Peter Summerfield.

As a member still juggling work and family commitments, I have trouble attending ACCAW meeting and events. Nonetheless, I appreciate the work done by the committee and club members and enjoy reading the club newsletter.

Searching for a way to contribute, I thought it may be of passing interest if I send through some photos and updates regarding my work on various VW cars in my family's possession.

The photos attached relate to a 1970 Beetle that came into our possession in 2018 for my then 16yo daughter, Nellie. At that stage, Nellie was yet to fully appreciate the value of good air conditioning and an automatic transmission! Since moving to Melbourne, Nellie has transitioned to a Corolla while the Beetle remains in our driveway.

The Beetle itself originates in South Africa. To most Australian VW enthusiasts the car looks odd to begin with, as this model has a late-model body (post 1967) but early-model running gear (most notably a swing axle gearbox, 5-lug wheels and drum brakes all round). When we purchased the car, we got papers associated with its importation by a lady who was moving to Australia and couldn't bear to leave her Beetle behind.

After a good deal of running repairs to get the car to a satisfactory standard, the Beetle has been a fun run-around for the kids. Most mileage has been racked up on the school run, with Nellie driving herself and three younger siblings to Xavier High School each day for a year or



1970 South African Beetle.

Although most of the issues are now sorted, the Achilles heel of this car has been a suspected receding exhaust valve seat which has required constant adjustment to keep the engine functioning. Recently I finally decided to bite the proverbial bullet and pull the 1500cc engine as the first step towards rectification. I'd previously assembled a spare 1600cc engine with a plan for a quick swap over, keeping the Beetle drivable while I manage the valve issue. Here are several progress photos.



On closer inspection, the offending exhaust valve is receding a whopping 5mm into the head.

> To work on the car I used my mid-rise scissor lift, sold in Australia by AAQ.

2.7 tonne lift limit, lifts 1200mm, 15 amps. Does the job, but if I had the roof clearance I'd still prefer a two pole hoist

**Jerricans:** The American jerrican, was adapted from a similar can used by the German army in Africa. British military units had captured samples of the German 20 litre variety and had forwarded them to the US Army for evaluation in the summer of 1940.

The German Wehrmacht cans were found to be stackable, strong and light weight, useful with any fluid, found to have an excellent handle and spout and no accessories were needed for use.

The Transport Division of the US Quartermaster Corp endorsed the can and ordered their depot at camp Holabird,

Maryland, to draw up specifications for an American version.

A decision was made to redesign parts of the can to make it easier to manufacture on American Assembly lines in large quantities and to make it a 5 gallon US can. Also, the design was changed from 2 somewhat similar pieces welded along the centre seam to 3 main sections with welded seams and a rolled-on bottom. The cam style closure was abandoned in favour of the Army standard 2 ½ inch threaded top.

In the end, there was one feature that was common to both the US and the German can – a three bar handle on the top that made it easier to pass the can from one man to another.

Contracts were awarded to 4 firms (Chattanooga Stamping Company, National Enamelling and Stamping Company, Pittsburgh Steel Barrel Company and Wheeling Corrugating Company.

Production numbers are not available for 1941 and 1942, but numbers were high enough so that every Ford and Willys Jeep produced after August 1 1942 were equipped with a spare gas can attached to the jeep's rear panel. During 1943 to 1945, over 22,443,000 US pattern cans were produced.

After the D-Day landings, a severe shortage of the US 5 gallon can saw the development of the British jerricans which were nearly identical to the German Wehrmacht variety, with a cam lock spout. By comparison the German / British style can weighed 11 ½ pounds empty and 44 pounds full, while the American can weighed 10 pounds empty and 40 pounds full. The tin can style construction of the US version proved to be ideal for a high volume product and it was found that less than 1% of the American production leaked.

Also, a 5 gallon US pattern water can was put into production in 1942. It was the same size and of similar construction to the gas can except for the spout and the baked-on synthetic inner lining. The 3 ½ inch cam lock spout made it easier to clean inside after it had been used for food (soup / coffee) and the lining prevented rust. A pouring spout nearly identical to the German / British can lock spout was developed for the US cans which also helped distinguish them from the fuel carrying cans.

What do the numbers tell us? (From the NSW Historic Motoring Association - ACCAW is a Member)



NSW HMA represents a quarter of all clubs on the Transport for NSW "List of Recognised Clubs of NSW".

We can expect that we have a total of around 20,000 vehicles registered in the two NSW Historic Registration Schemes.

#### **Current NSW HVS and CVS registrations:**

Our best guess at current registration numbers on the schemes is: HVS about 70,000 vehicles and CVS about 6,000 vehicles.

A total of no more than 80,000. We are certain that, given a credible definition of HVS eligibility, as well as the new CVS plates and other possible improvements to CVS processing there could be a further migration from HVS to CVS of at least 10,000 vehicles.

Other 30-year old vehicles on full registration in NSW possibly as many as 200,000. This year, 1994 vehicles become 30-years old. This annual boost to the eligible numbers will reach a peak in the near future. More-modern vehicles will largely fail to achieve 30 years of age. We are aware that there are many vehicles eligible for HVS and CVS (within our clubs) that remain on full registration for various reasons. Some are protecting original or personalised plates. Numbers unknown. Laid-up vehicles etc:

We know that many club members have one or more old vehicles suitable for restoration that may eventually enter the schemes. These numbers are unknown.

Additionally, outside the clubs, there are many thousands of old vehicles available for parts or restoration. The total number of restorable laid-up vehicles is: Probably at least 100,000.

Conclusion: In all we could have a total of around 400,000 vehicles over 30 years of age in NSW and that number is approaching a peak as the annual inflow reduces.
