August Feature Car



Geoff Lenton presented his 1948 Riley 2.5 litre as the feature car for the August meeting. Geoff bought the car in 2015 and is the fourth registered owner. He explained that he bought the vehicle from a deceased estate. It had been left unregistered in a leaky shed with the back half of the car sticking out in the weather. This contributed to the rot in the wooden frame of the roof in particular. Geoff subsequently had to have the roof professionally repaired.

He said that the original design was copied in part from a 501 BMW. He thought it was intended to be of a steel construction. "But wood and labour was cheaper than steel just after the War so Nuffield stayed with the coach building that they had the jigs for," he explained.

Geoff owned another Riley in 1980 (which he had to sell to finance his divorce) and was pleased to get back into Riley ownership. He said he came home from hospital as a baby in a Riley, which started his love affair with the marque.

The car has a twin cam hemi engine with a crossflow head and twin SU carbies. It was considered a sophisticated vehicle for its day and, while not quick off the mark, it could manage 90 mph. However the car was equipped with poor brakes. Geoff joked that it took two weeks to accelerate to top speed but another four weeks to pull the car up.

Geoff described the car as a fine cruising vehicle which was very happy on smooth roads but did not like bumpy ones. He said that it had hydraulic dampers on the rear and telescopics on the front, together with torsion bar suspension. It was not suited to rough roads. However the car's very firm ride make it good to handle on the highway.

Geoff explained that the car had never been fully restored. Rather it had been fettled by each of its owners. Each owner had had the car for over 20 years. Geoff quipped that he couldn't say whether that was because they couldn't sell it or because they loved it.

Variety Bash Report

Club Members James Park and Simon Anderson have made it safely back home after successfully completing the 8-day Variety Club Bash from Swan Hill to Airlie Beach in the mighty Ford Laser. James made daily posts on Facebook during the trip. These included the following details:

"We are happy to say Simon and I made it back in one piece as well as the little Laser, although the Laser is a bit more battered and bruised than us.

"We managed to do the 3200km between Airlie Beach and Geelong in 2.5 days which was a tremendous effort for the car and us."

James and Simon had to nurse a problematic gearbox from early in the Bash. The Laser also suffered a few other problems.

James explained: "We made it back (to Geelong) thanks to completing 4 gearbox fluid changes and one bottle of additive, using 3 bottles of Chem-i-weld to seal our head gasket/cracked head, a ratchet strap to hold the front engine mount in and 2 foam gardening kneeling pads stuffed into the back springs to hold the back end of the car up."

James also described the benefits of the Bash. "The other amazing thing is the impact. We made over \$100k of grants and resource gifting to small state schools along the way. The biggest school we stopped at had just over 60 pupils and smallest being a self-funded preschool with less than 20 pupils."

James and Simon will be the guest speakers at the October general meeting, and will provide lots more details about their adventure then.










VALE - GAYLENE TELFER

21/10/1951 - 20/7/2024

Gaylene and Peter Telfer have been active members of the WDHVC over many years and it was with great sadness that a strong contingent of club members attended her funeral on 26 July.

Peter described Gaylene as an "extraordinary wife, mother and granny". During the eulogy he and his sons told of a loving and generous person who was



He explained that he was working underground at Broken Hill when he first saw Gaylene as a 21-year-old, at a Rotaract meeting. After two years travelling overseas, they married at Merbein and moved to Leopold, where two boys were born. From the outset Gaylene was an active volunteer at playgroup, kindergarten and school. She had a lifelong passion for helping those with an intellectual disability, also volunteering at Karingal House, where her parents also worked, and attending to the integration needs of disabled students in schools across Western Victoria. The birth of their third son coincided with a year working as house parents at Karingal House themselves.

Another community activity in which Gaylene and the family was involved was the initiation of the Wallington Strawberry Fair. She remained active within the school parents club and the scouting movement as her family grew up. Her sons told of her patience and involvement with their activities and later those of her grandchildren, and also of how the family home regularly hosted many of their friends.

Gaylene had a long interest in craft activities and when husband Peter initiated the tech nights at the Club, Gaylene offered craft activities to the women while their husbands talked about car components in the garage next door.

VALE - MARGARET BUFTON

2/2/1953 - 1/8/2024

The club extends sincere condolences to Les Bufton and his family at the passing of Margaret. Les joined our club in 2023 and has been a regular attendee at club events, including the recent run to Scotsburn.

Margaret and Les met at a wedding in 1975. After they married, they settled on a farm at Balliang, quite change for a city girl.



Margaret credited the deep soaking she had earlier given her vegie garden for saving their house when, in the 1980s, a bushfire rolled over it with she and her two children inside. While the house was untouched, the rest of the farm was burnt and needed to be rebuilt.

At her funeral Margaret's sister Monica spoke of her creativity, which included dressmaking and flair for color. Her skills translated into many fine clothes for her family and others.

Eldest son Shannon, spoke of his mother's vibrant spirit, describing her as a "pocket rocket". He said that a passion for fashion sparked a lifelong love affair with style and design. She was a positive person who encouraged others to follow their dreams. To ensure her children had the education and life opportunities she wanted for them, Margaret started a small business, working long hours to make colorful windcheaters that she sold at markets.

About 15 years ago Les and Margaret sold the farm and moved to Torquay, renovating their new house and garden together.

As well as her active involvement in the local community, Margaret and Les would regularly take their caravan on trips. They also travelled overseas with friends.

In July 2022 a grandson was born, giving Margaret and Les great joy. Her daughter Elise described how much Margaret enjoyed being a grandma. However not long after, Margaret was diagnosed with cancer.
