

From the President







Member Spotlight— Graham Johnson Pt 2

Each week I was still scanning the News Papers for an early 7 for Edd and there it was, an ad for a 1929 Austin 7 roadster and a 1924 Humber roadster both in the same advert. The cars were in Auburn and when we got there we found them parked side by side in a shearing shed. The other thing we found out you couldn't buy one without buying the other. That had stopped 2 buyers before us. Not to worry I will buy the Humber and sell it

later, you can get the 7. Ok says Edd, "Oh" I should involve Pearl (Edd's wife) so she is comfortable with my choice. Pearl comes in and immediately gravitates to the Humber. So the deal is done I end up with the 29 Austin and Edd gets the Humber.

Now back to model "A"s, I won't bore you with too much of my vintage car history but after building 2 engines and doing other repairs on both cars we lined up for the next B to B.

The Tudor took up room in my shed just sitting there with no engine. Neil Phillips comes to my rescue and says I have some engine blocks in my old chicken house you can come and choose one. This I did and work on reconditioning the motor began again.


Sometime later Neil reports to the members that he has come across a very rare Canadian 1930 Town Sedan. The car was a 2 family car and was in very good original condition. He explained that if the members could get the car going, the owner would join the club and display it at events. A number of members turned up and worked on the car. I was smitten with it. It was everything I wanted in an old car. Time passed and I saw another interesting add in the Advertiser for a 1930 left hand drive Town Sedan. I think I know that car so on to the phone, inspect the car again, find out it is too much for me. I gave the owner my phone number and told him I really liked his car but I couldn't make his asking price and if it doesn't sell to get back to me. Some months later his business falls over and he rings and negotiations take place and we agree on a price that I could come up to.

So now we are the third family owners of the sedan. Now to work. The original brake linings and wheel bearings were removed and replaced, the radiator recored, water pump overhauled, two burnt valves replaced the bores honed and pistons fitted with new rings. The bearing clearances were checked and found to be okay and ½ inch of sandy dirt was removed from the valve spring chamber and the sump. All moving parts were lubed and oils changed. I then fitted an extra tail light and two side mirrors, tided up the wiring and removed the seized shockers.

After a very rigorous inspection at Regency Park it passes and goes straight on to club rego with a Left Hand Drive Exemption paper.

I finished it just in time for the 1994 National at Immanuel College and we have been happy Model Aer's ever since. The mileage was 42,000. After about three years of limited use I decided to pull the engine and overall it properly. Now I had a fully reconditioned engine on the bench which was for the Tudor, so in the Sedan it went. Poor Tudor, surplus to requirements again. I had been doing some work on the car like having the radiator re-cored, fitting cast iron brake drums to the rear, rebuilding the gearbox and chroming bumpers etc. The Tudor was nearly driveable several times but other cars always got in the way and I used the recon bits and pieces. It took Wayne Stapleton to fit an engine and gearbox etc. to get it back on the road as he purchased it from me so I could purchase our 400A Sports convertible.


The one and only T




