### ON THIS DAY (FLASHBACKS FROM THE BOW-TIE ARCHIVES)

### 20 YEARS AGO (June 2004)

Carl Kelsen wrote an article on the establishment and early years of the club



to celebrate the 30th birthday. About 80 people attended the 30th birthday run to Castlemaine, Ken James submitted a rundown on the birthday weekends events. Ken lived in Harcourt so he'd offered to help Marty Mavrik with the planning for the run. Peter Mantel's daughter Christie wrote about the 28th National Festival hosted by our club in Yarrawonga (no Covid to disrupt the event back then). Christie and her friend were a bit disappointed that they had to travel up in a Ford after school on Friday as Peter was already up there in his Camaro. Although they were pretty happy to ride in the lead car on Saturday's observation run, Tom Brereton's 69 Indy Pace Car Camaro. Letters to

the Editor; one was asking about an electronic copy of the magazine to save the club printing and mailing costs, well we finally got there in January 2020. The second letter was looking for their 2004 Members Directory, he was advised that it would come out with the August **Bow-Tie**. When the current website went live in 2016 the committee decided to cease publication of the directory, partly due to the expense, but also as it was out of date the month after it was printed due to new members joining. Instead the members directory is now available on the website and is always up to date. If you didn't know its listed under the ABOUT US tab and can only be accessed after logging in so it is only visible to paid members. And finally in the classifieds member #327 had 48 parts for sale ads, surely a record.

#### 40 YEARS AGO (June 1984)

A report on the 8th National Chevrolet Festival noted that Peter Mantel won the trophy for Best Camaro, 58-64 went to Paul Kelsen's '59 Bel Air and best '74 was Frank Connelly's '74 Caprice.



A sub committee headed by Peter McKenzie was hard at work preparing to host the 9th Festival in March 1985. Back in 1984 meetings were held in the Camberwell Civic Centre and "last minute details" for club events were in the used car section of Saturdays Age newspaper. "Know Your Fellow Member" was Mick Kimpton #446, Mick got hooked on Chev's when he was 15 and his father bought a 1960 Bel Air. GM ownership for Mick commenced with a HT Monaro (Chev powered), then an LC Torana before he finally went American with a 1962 Pontiac Laurentian. The Pontiac was currently undergoing a total rebuild so Mick picked up a '62 Chev to get around in. After the June '84 monthly meeting was closed at 9:15 two guest speakers from Ignition Developments gave a talk which, with members questions continued (including a supper break) until the caretaker came to lock up at 11pm. That's even longer than one of Geoff's presentations. n shops were closed on Sundays.

Saturday night saw about 25 of us having dinner in the Tanswell Hotel and although not all sitting together it was an easy night with an open fire to help us all lubricate the conversation.

Sunday was the big day as we were now integrated into the Beechworth Old Cranks Motor Club weekend and we have to commend David McKay (President) and Diane Ryan (Secretary) for the briefing of the marshals as our cars were grouped together and all officials were aware of our 12-noon departure.

Nearly all Beechworth retail was open (we did have a 10am





booking at the Beechworth Bakery) and most of the main street was closed with display cars lining both sides of the road and we were located in a massive paddock which filled with display vehicles and the weather was perfect. Because of the size of all the display areas anywhere between 5 to 6 hundred cars were present and in fact some were still arriving as we motored off to the BENALLA GOLF CLUB for lunch.

Craig O'Donoghue won a prize for his beautiful '59 red/white Corvette which some local kids thought was a racing car because of the cross-flag emblems on the mudguards and with Craig driving who knows.

Overall, the OLD CRANKS get a 10 out of 10 for a well-run event and maybe we could consider a bi or tri annual visit as the date coincides with our annual Club Birthday Run. The Golf Club lunch went well and it was pleasing to see not just our number one member and his lovely wife present but also several older members too.... "Three cheers for them"


