# 25th Avoca Rally Report

Well there we were again, lined up at the Fyansford Hotel car park for a 9:45am start, on the club's annual rally to Avoca. After departing right on time we ventured across to the Ballarat Road then turning off through Bannockburn, proceeding onto Shelford then off to the right just out of Shelford and on through Mount Mercer then to Buninyong. If any of our members have not been this way through Mount Mercer it is well worth the drive to see one of the largest windfarms around. This route to Ballarat was taken due to long stretches of the Ballarat Road being under roadworks.

From Buninyong we went around the back way through Sebastopol then on to the highway to Avoca. A very leisurely drive on to Avoca, arriving early afternoon. After settling into our motel rooms and getting a bit of lunch we all joined together around 3pm at the Avoca Motel for drinks and nibbles.



Netta Warren produced a lovely fruitcake to complex and commemorate the occasion of 25 years of this rally. Everyone thought it rather fitting that Netta and Ick-up – all Trevor should cut the cake as they had participated in every one of the rallies – a great effort. Friday evening dinner was at the Victoria Hotel, a very pleasant meal and all retiring reasonably early for a well-earned rest stop. complex and outdoor lock lock-up – all very fine examples. John took us where some countryside very fine examples.

On Saturday morning we started off for Dunolly to the Alvah Art Gallery. On our arrival we were split into two groups, with the ladies heading off to the gallery and the gents off to the shed. The gallery housed all original artworks of prints and paintings and cards, some of these being purchased by our members. In the shed Jon Moir had several vehicles under restoration, these being a 1927 Essex six cylinder tourer and a 1917 Oakland tourer. The Oakland had a lot of our own club history. It was first purchased by the late Tom Anderson prior to the formation of our club. Tom was then a member of the Veteran Car Club of Victoria Australia. When purchased it was believed to be of veteran car origin that some time later the veteran car club dating committee dated it to around 1920, so Tom soon lost interest in it.

Tom sold the lovely roadster body off it to another veteran club member who thought it may have fitted a veteran Overland, but was never used. The remains of the car were handed on to Norm Wooley. I purchased the vehicle off Norm around 55 years ago, then sporting the tourer body which it now has. Having owned it for just on 40 years, still not restored, I decided to sell it. The person who purchased it lived in Camperdown, none other than John Moir and wife, our hosts today. The other vehicle Jon had was a very fine example of a 1928 Oakland sedan. Much to our surprise whilst John



was escorting us on a district tour, we found this car was extremely fast, sitting most of the time on the speed limit.

After the viewing of the gallery and of the shed we were hosted to a very lovely morning tea. On the tour afterwards John pointed out many historic buildings and landmarks in Dunolly and surrounding

district, one of which was the local courthouse and outbuildings consisting of a stable complex and outdoor lock lock-up – all very fine examples.



John took us up to Melville Caves, north of Dunolly where some magnificent views of the surrounding countryside were had. The massive rock formations of the whole surrounding area were great. Most of us experienced overheating problems due to quite a hot day and the long climb.

We ended up lunching at the new bridge hotel and returned to Avoca by 3pm. Our evening meal was

# REMINDER

The Western District Historic Vehicle Club of Geelong has a Deed of Agreement with VicRoads, a document setting out the requirements and obligations to be met by the club to operate under the Victorian Club Permit Scheme.

Under this scheme the members must notify the club permit officer when:

- a vehicle is sold.
- the permit has expired.
- there is a change to the address of the vehicle.
- plates are returned to VicRoads if a vehicle is sold or a permit has expired.

It is well known that if your club permit has expired, you will need to obtain another Roadworthy Certificate to reinstate your permit. If your permit expires, you cannot drive your vehicle: your vehicle will be uninsured.

We also request that you pay your permit before or on the due date so you're not uninsured and you are legal. If you don't receive your permit from VicRoads before the due date, it is your responsibility to notify VicRoads and collect a new permit form.

The club permit officer must sign this form BEFORE you go back to VicRoads.

This system has been working very well since the changes in February 2015, when a revision of the Logbook Scheme came into operation

# The World's Worst Cars?

This month *Backfire* includes a car dubbed a "Financial Failure" in the book *The World's Worst Cars*. Please don't take offence if your car features in this segment - the series is only a bit of fun to add to our magazine. And after all, the views expressed are only one man's opinion!

#### As taken from The World's Worst Cars by Craig Cheetham

#### FINANCIAL FAILURES

"When it comes to a car being a flop, it's fair to say that a car which bankrupts its manufacturer is a pretty spectacular dud. And many of the vehicles in this selection did just that - huge development costs, appalling sales records and a complete lack of showroom appeal meant their makers could never recoup the enormous investment required to bring the car to market. ... Some did not lose money in themselves, but acquired such an appalling reputation that the damage they did to their makers' reputations meant the losses suffered later on were immense."

VW K70: THE UNLIKELY FORERUNNER OF THE GOLF.

Having secured a strong reputation with the air-cooled Beetle and Type 3, Volkswagen tried to capture the conventional market with the K70:a water-cooled compact saloon car. It acquired the design when it took over struggling NSU in 1969, and continued to develop it, introducing a car that was well-made, good to drive and very refined. But it was an unmitigated financial disaster.

Volkswagen had built its reputation on interchangeable parts, which made its cars inexpensive to produce. However, nothing on the K70 was shared with other VWs, and its build costs were so high that when it reached showrooms it was significantly more expensive than most of it rivals.

Regardless, Volkswagen went on to protect its own reputation by re-engineering all other NSU vehicles to join the Audi range – something of an irony in itself, as today Audi is regarded as a more prestigious brand than VW itself.


The K70's design certainly was advanced – so much so that it cost VW far too much to build and never turned a profit, it was an unmitigated financial disaster. It was originally designed as an NSU, and those influences are evident in the K70's styling. Note in particular the scalloped sides and drilled steel wheels. Dynamically, the car was actually very able.

It had an impressive ride, and at its launch the steering was praised by road-testers for its feel and accuracy.

Volkswagen's first water-cooled car wasn't a success, it took four more years until the Golf was launched to make its conventional engines truly reliable.

Volkswagen's K70 actually wasn't a bad little car, but the fact that it couldn't use any other VW parts made production costs prohibitive, and it was a financial write-off.


